- Exhibits to be delivered: 16th November (6.30 pm-8.30 pm) or 17th November (9.00 am-11.00 am) (Early entry forms: 6th November)
- Exhibitors enter through Gate No 4, Royal Street, Tuart Hill (see map)
- Except for Floral Art, exhibitors must have owned the exhibits for a period of 3 months and should be prepared, if required, to lodge a sworn declaration with the Secretary that the flowers and plants are their bona fide property.
- Judging will commence: 12 noon Friday

Specimens

- A vase must be greater in height than in width.
- Three cuts means three containers – one for each cut.
- Containers are supplied.
- NND = Not Necessarily Distinct.
- Geraniums and pelargoniums should be staged with a leaf behind the flower.

Floral Art

- Horticultural material must predominate throughout.
- No artificial fruit or flowers whatsoever are permitted unless stated in Schedule.
- Foliage Designs. minimal accessories such as sticks and stones may be used.
- Maximum space allowed: 75 cm wide and 60 cm deep. For an exhibit to be correctly placed, it should not take up more than two thirds (2/3) of this space for an advantageous judging position.
- There are no other restrictions unless specifically stated.

**This may be anything from a Kindy hand painting to the Mona Lisa, from the 3 YO's play dough efforts to the statue of David. It would be advisable to place a small photo next to it on the bench so the judge can see the inspiration.

Pot Plants

- A pot plant shall be defined as any plant successfully grown in a container or pot for decorative purposes.
- Plants must be grown and shown in pots not exceeding 30 cm in diameter unless otherwise specified.
- Hanging containers must not exceed 35 cm diameter.
- Multiple plantings must be distinct so that the judge may assess the number of plants present in the container.
